LOT RENTS: The new amounts go into effect January 1st, 2020 A letter was sent in September 2019 informing you of the amounts. The following choices are still in effect for making your payments: If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact me.

- * <u>ACH</u> (also known as direct debit) Most have signed up for this option which is the most effective way. For this option, you do not need to do anything. The amount comes out on the 3rd of the month automatically. If you wish to switch to this method, please let me know.
- * COUPON BOOK The new books have been sent and you should have by Friday, 12/29/19. They were sent to the address we had on record. The new coupon book has all the updated info in it including labels to the where they are to be mailed which is Center State Bank, PO Box 20846, Tampa, Florida.
- * ONLINE BANKING- If you currently use online banking whereby you enter the information yourself, you will need to update the amount on your bank website or you will not pay the correct amount.

* ONLINE PAYMENT PORTAL- The Resident

Portal is at: www.newbymanagement.com.

You can pay by e-check as well as by credit card. Should you choose to use your credit card, you will be charged the 3-5% processing fee that the credit card companies charge. You can also see your account with your charges and payments.

Some have indicated that their banks take the money out directly. This means that you have set it up directly with your bank to be taken out and you would need to contact your bank and update your NEW information with them. Again, your coupon book provides the new info.
